
NIS2



- The NIS2 Directive is the EU-wide legislation on cybersecurity. It provides legal measures to boost the overall level of cybersecurity in the EU.
 - <u>Directive on measures for a high common level of cybersecurity across</u> the Union (NIS2 Directive) | Shaping Europe's digital future (europa.eu)
- Directive of the European Union
- Not binding by itself
- Needs to be implemented into national law
- Therefore, it will be slightly different in each member country = 27 flavors
- Disclaimer: EU Directive vs Czech CS Law (draft) and translations
- No room for detailed presentation, therefore, just highlights and what I think is important for Rail Industry



TIMELINE



- Long History: NIS1, NIS2
- Deadline October 17th
- Current Status Czechia:
 - Government Approved
 - Currently in Parliament
 - October not realistic
 - Will become effective in 2025 (Let's Hope!)
- Many other countries in similar position
- But there is no doubt it will be implemented in all EU countries







Cyber Security requirements as defined in national law based on important or essential level





Article 3

Definitions

For the purpose of this Directive, the following definitions apply:

- (1) railway undertaking means any public or private undertaking licensed according to this Directive, the principal business of which is to provide services for the transport of goods and/or passengers by rail with a requirement that the undertaking ensure traction; this also includes undertakings which provide traction only;
- (2) infrastructure manager means any body or firm responsible in particular for establishing, managing and maintaining railway infrastructure, including traffic management and control-command and signalling; the functions of the infrastructure manager on a network or part of a network may be allocated to different bodies or firms;
